#### An integration challenge:





- Selection based on geographical, gender and age balance







Existing space, structure, object, material, event, practice or habit that for you represent concrete contemporary examples of new forms of living showing that the values of the New European Bauhaus already exist.


#### **Ideas & visions**

## First results Challenges mentioned more

Addressing social inequalities in regards to immigrant communities, elderly people, people with special needs and disadvantaged groups; **Fostering social inclusion and interactions** by creating spaces for dialogue, strengthening communities and social ties, resource-sharing, social equity, as well as community participation in decisionmaking.

**The lack of high-quality public spaces.** A number of proposals affirm the need to build or improve meeting spaces for inclusion, cultural or artistic expression and reaffirm the people's right to the city;

**Disconnection from nature** and lack of green spaces in urban areas;

The unsustainable use of resources and waste, notably in regards to linear use of resources, but also to the obsolete uses for buildings, infrastructures and physical spaces.



What next? Delivery

- New European Bauhaus prize: launched in April 2021 to reward inspirational examples
- A support framework including call for proposals for pilots: at least 5 places where the New European Bauhaus can be materialized distributed in the EU involving various member states by September 2021
- Flanking measures to build the New European Bauhaus community, both budgetary (other calls) and non budgetary (e.g. standards).
- The support structure (combination of several EU instruments) will be refined during the design phase and adapted over time.



## ECCE's involvement

ECCE has become an official partner of the New European Bauhaus.

The European Council of Civil Engineers is ready to support the development of this initiative, notably by:

- acting as an information platform and facilitating dissemination and dialogue through the broad ECCE network (able to reach a large audience via our member organisations);
- enabling contact with renowned professionals and experts, who would be able to give greater visibility to the initiative;
- offering a knowledge and expertise hub, to help the European Commission to further design the initiative and ensure that its process delivers the desired outcomes;
- acting as a partner for co-organising consultations, co-creation initiatives, and awareness-raising events targeting professionals;
- The European Engineers' Day a regular European Engineering event co-organized
   with other European Engineering Organisations as an event to discuss and disseminate projects and results of the New European Bauhaus.

### ECCE's statement

17

#### A Resilient New Bauhaus: the need for safe, sound and sustainable buildings

The idea is that the climate emergency can be faced from a multidisciplinary perspective and with the ultimate goal of reaching a circular economy bringing together the construction and the culture sector, thus considering beauty and humanity values together with a greener architecture. So, it opens the door to a *more holistic approach* to our built environment.

The European Council of Civil Engineers would like to bring forward and highlight the *importance of structural safety* of the buildings which unfortunately has not been considered at least to the necessary extent.

We strongly believe that the European New Bauhaus initiative should **take into account the need for integrating structural/seismic upgrade of existing buildings, with energy efficiency and aesthetic improvements**. Buildings' safety is a very important factor which needs to be part of the holistic approach to our common efforts to ensure a safe, beautiful and sustainable built environment.
